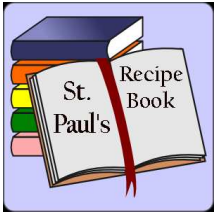

When school starts, for many families there are no worries of their children going back to school without being fully equipped. But for some the reality is that they just don't have the financial means for getting the items that their children need.

Last year in Kanata, we helped out about 48 families, which included 121 children and 4 adults that were back in school. There will be many others that just don't come to us for help, as they feel embarrassed to admit that they cannot do it, they will try and sell something that they have in order to get the money for supplies.

There are many ways that the community can help these families - you can drop off the items at any of the grocery store bins in Kanata, or stop by the food Cupboard. We are normally here in the morning from 9 am to noon. Or you can make a financial donation, please mark on your cheque for "school supplies" and forward to Kanata Food Cupboard, 20 Young road, Kanata K2L 1W1 or call to make arrangements for pickups.

Here is a list of the items that we are looking for: paper, scribblers, pens, markers, crayons, math sets, dictionaries, calculators, glue sticks white out, back packs, combination locks, pencils cases, pencil crayons, graph paper, scissors, pencil sharpeners, high lighters, erasers, rulers, duo-tangs, lunch boxes, and binders.
